Adult reads →

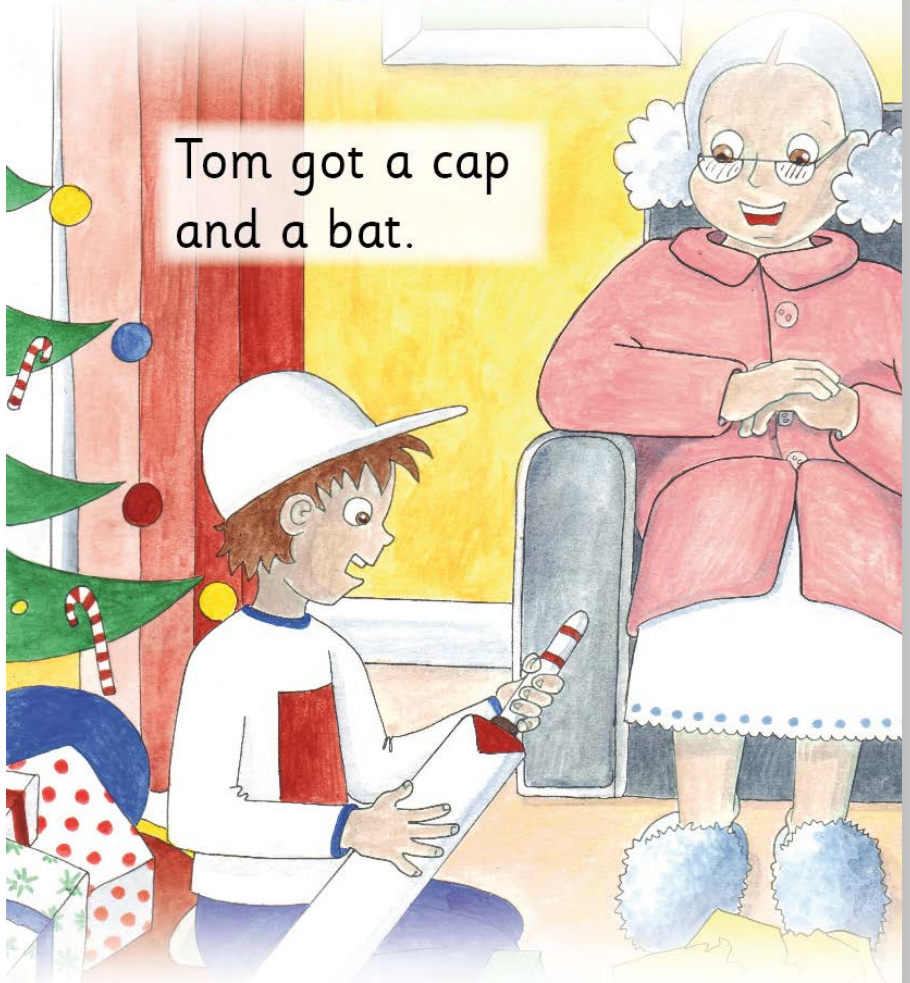
'Here's a present for you, Tom. Happy Christmas!' said Nan, handing him a package. 'I know how much you love cricket.'

Tom and Nan woke up bright and early on Christmas Day.

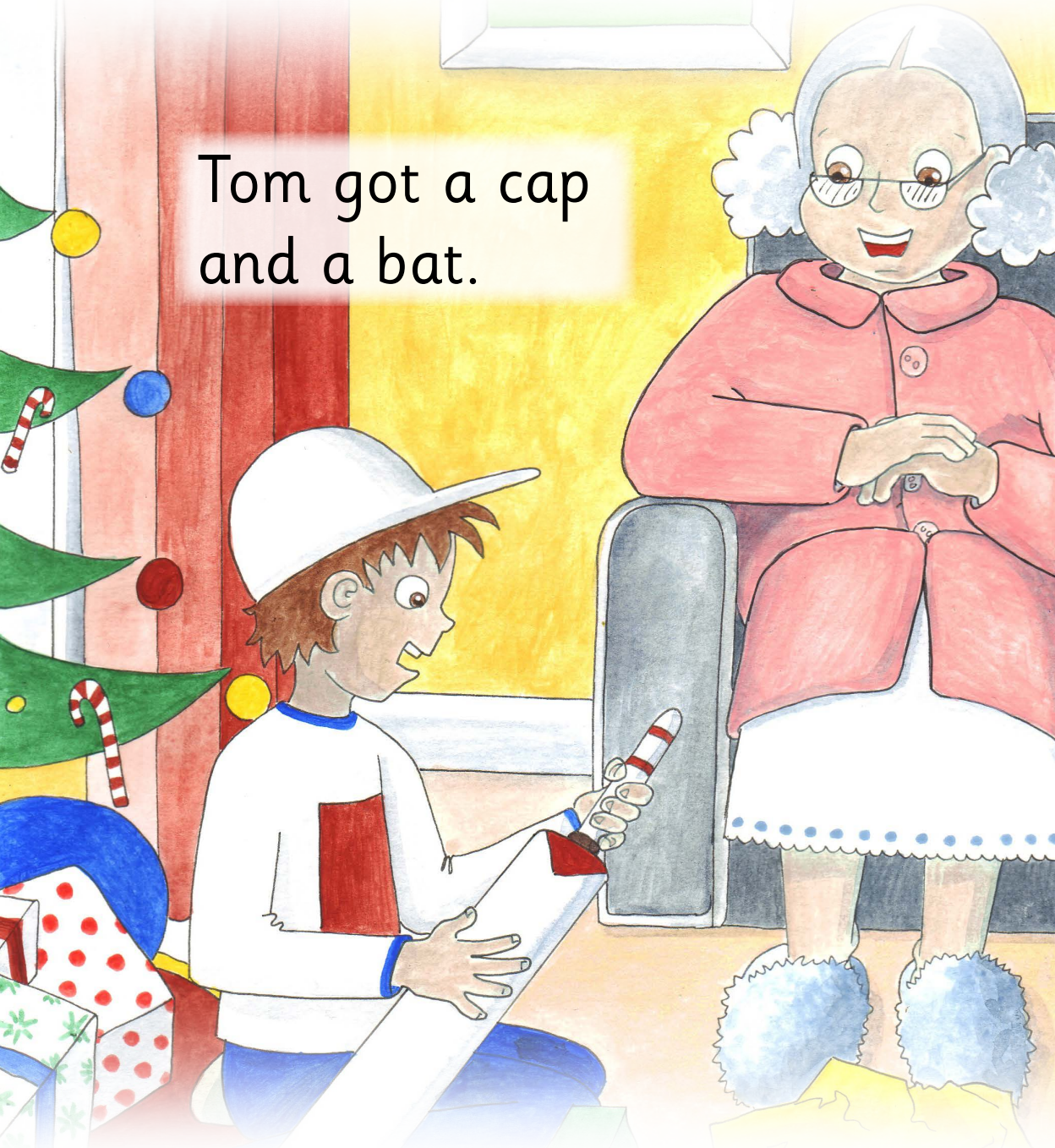

'Here's a present for you, Tom. Happy Christmas!' said Nan, handing him a package. 'I know how much you love cricket.'

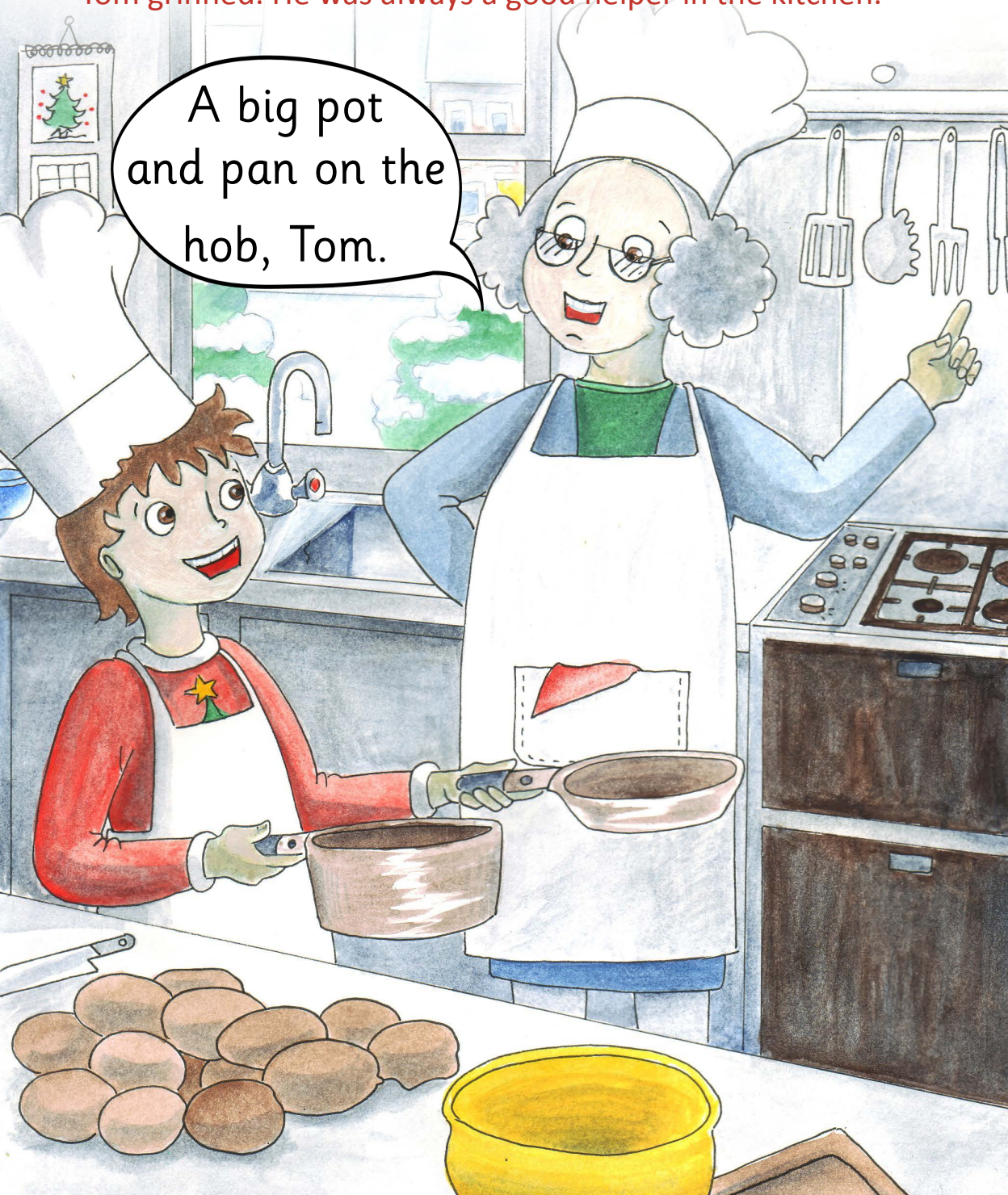
Tom got a cap
and a bat.




'Oh, Nan! This is the best gift ever. Thank you!' said Tom.

'Everyone will be here soon,' said Nan. 'I'll get the turkey out of the oven.'

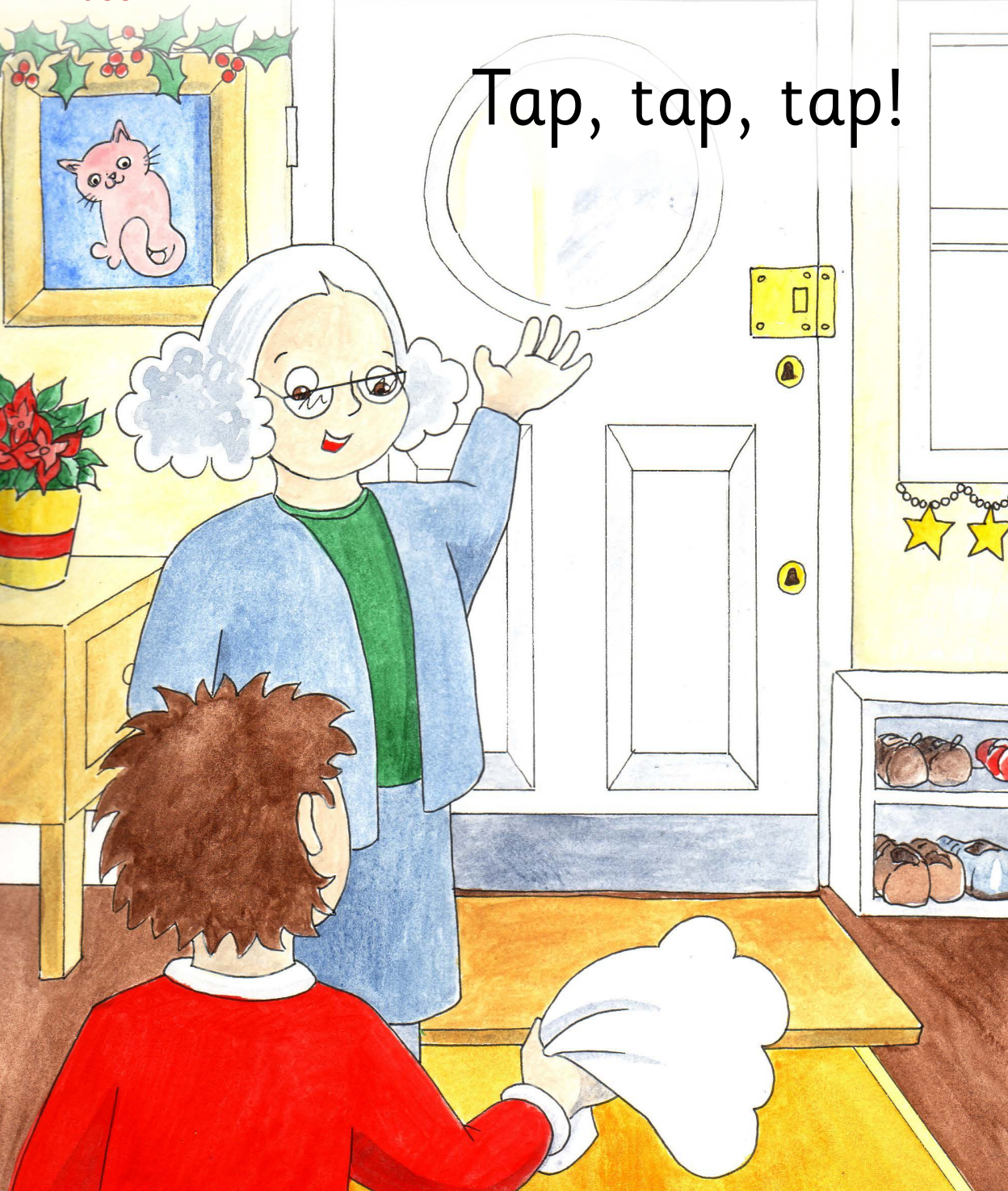
'I can help put the vegetables in a nice dish!' sang Tom.

Tap, tap, tap!

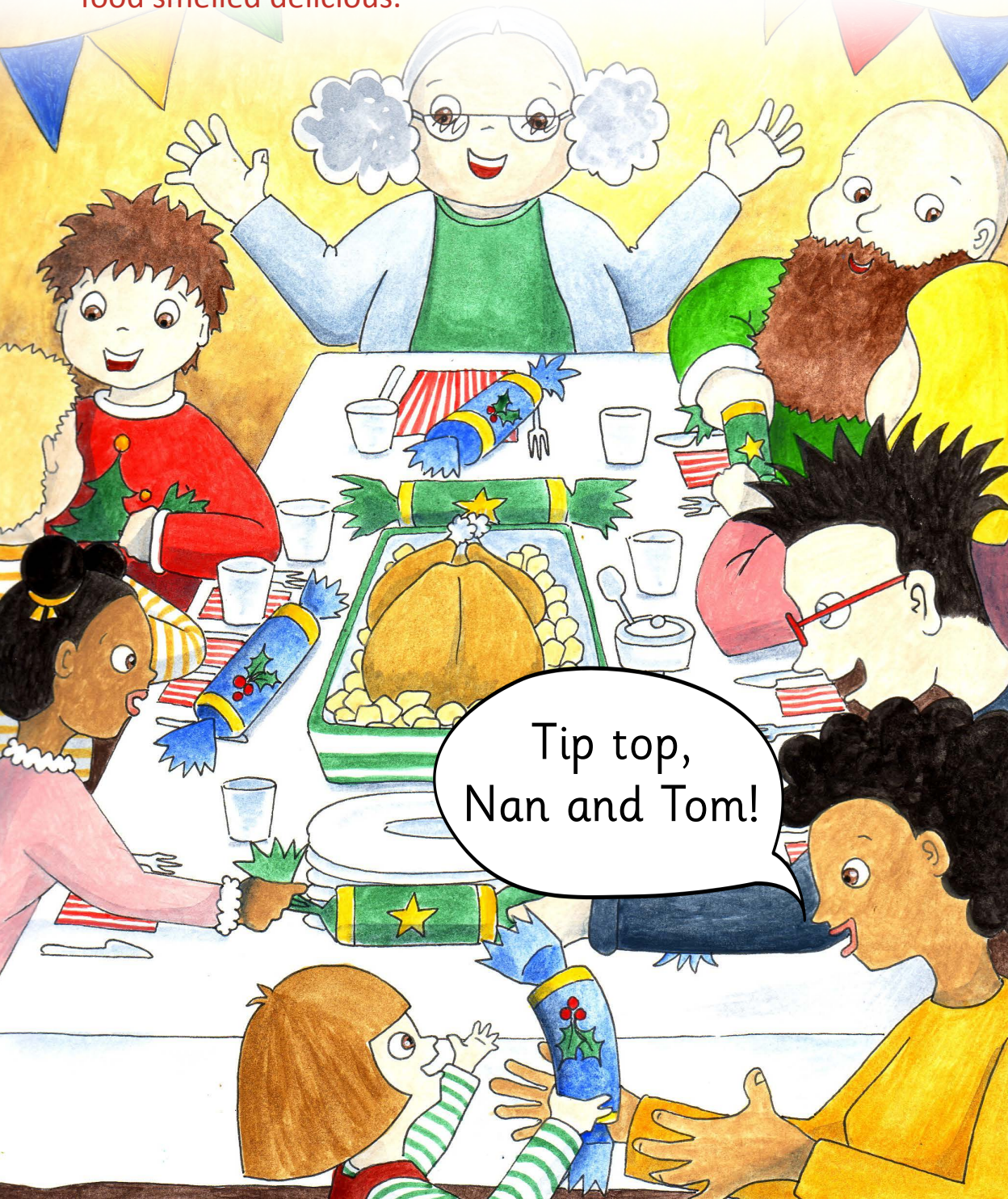


Aunties, uncles and cousins all crowded into the house. There were hugs for everyone. They brought a bag of toys for Tom.
