

Sex Education Vocabulary taught at Chadsmoor Federation

Sex education is not compulsory in primary school and consequently parents have the right to withdraw their child if they wish to. The Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education and Health Education Guidance (2020) states that although it is not a requirement, “It is important that the transition phase before moving to secondary school supports the pupils ongoing emotional and physical development effectively. The Department (Education) continues to recommend therefore that all primary schools **should** have a sex education programme tailored to the age and the physical and emotional maturity of the pupils. It should ensure that both boys and girls are prepared for the changes that adolescence brings and- drawing on knowledge of the human life cycle as set out in the national curriculum for science – how a baby is conceived and born.”
